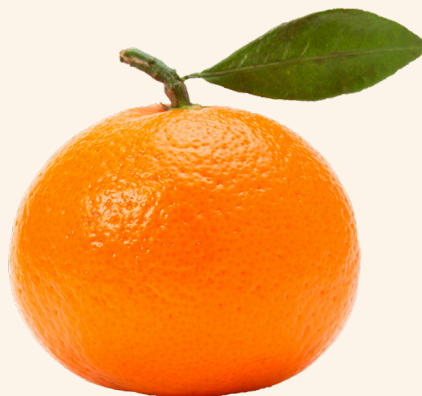


## TANGERINE AVANA



The Havana (*Citrus reticulata*) is a citrus fruit that ripens early (we can find fruits already in November). Its fruit are round-shaped and slightly crushed on the tips.

The leaves are green, tending to clear; the bearing is generally bushy.

Havana variety contains a large amount of juice, which has a lot of benefits: it may even play a role in the prevention of cancer and many other diseases. The skin is medium-small. However, it has some seeds, even if not many.

You can use this fruit in many ways: it can be used to produce essences, desserts, liqueurs, ice cream and many other dishes. In a sheltered environment, covered by the direct frost, the plant can resist to temperatures of about  $-7^{\circ}\text{C}$ .
